Lament

Therefore, I will mourn and lament. I will walk around barefoot and naked. I will howl like a jackal and moan like an owl. For my people's wound is too deep to heal.

1:8-9

Hope

Where is another God like you, who pardons the guilt of the remnant . . . You delight in showing unfailing love. 7:18

¹⁰Don't tell our enemies in Gath; don't weep at all. You people in Beth-leaphrah, roll in the dust to show your despair.

In Hebrew, the words *tell* and *Gath* are similar.

Beth Aphrah means "House of Dust."

¹¹ You people in Shaphir, go as captives into exile naked and ashamed. The people of Zaanan dare not come outside their walls.

Shaphir means "pleasant" (a contrast to their shame).

Zaanan sounds like the word for "come out" (they couldn't).

The people of Beth-ezel mourn, for their house has no support. 12 The people of Maroth anxiously wait for relief, but only bitterness awaits them . . .

Beth Ezel means
"House of Firmness"
(they had none and could not stand).

Maroth sounds like the word for "bitter"

¹³ Harness your chariot horses and flee, you people of Lachish. You were the first city in Judah to follow Israel in her rebellion, and you led Jerusalem into sin.

Lachish sounds like the word for "team" (as in "team of chariot horses").

¹⁴ Send farewell gifts to Moresheth-gath; there is no hope of saving it.

MoreshethGath is similar to the word for "betrothed" and refers to Judah being forced to pay a dowry.

The town of Aczib has deceived the kings of Israel. ¹⁵ O people of Mareshah, I will bring a conqueror to capture your town.

Achzib means deception.

Mareshah sounds like the word for conqueror.

3 Key Passages 5:2-5

² But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, are only a small village among all the people of Judah. Yet a ruler of Israel, whose origins are in the distant past, will come from you on my behalf. 5:2










In the last days, the mountain of the Lord's house will be the highest of all—the most important place on earth. It will be raised above the other hills, and people from all



over the world will stream there to worship. ² People from many nations will come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of Jacob's God. There he will teach us his ways, and we



will walk in his paths." For the Lord's teaching will go out from Zion; his word will go out from Jerusalem. ³ The Lord will mediate between peoples and will settle disputes between strong nations far away.



They will hammer their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will no longer fight against nation, nor train for war anymore. ⁴ Everyone will



live in peace and prosperity, enjoying their own grapevines and fig trees, for there will be nothing to fear. The Lord of Heaven's Armies has made this promise!
